The Town of Esopus offers numerous walking trails. Take 5 walks on any of the 27 designated trails and pick up your Esopus Explorer Badge (shown above in a reduced size). Trail Maps are located at Park Trailheads and Town Buildings listed on the map side of this brochure.

The Esopus trail system covers a range of ability levels including handicapped access. Walk only as much of each trail as your ability and circumstances permit. Esopus Explorers is about encouraging a healthy lifestyle and appreciating our environment.

The Esopus trail system is assessable all year round. Walk or snow-shoe to enjoy magnificent views of the Hudson River from Scenic Hudson and Port Ewen Riverside Greenway Trails; experience the vistas that inspired the Hudson Valley's literary past and environmental preservation efforts at John Burroughs Nature Sanctuary and Slabsides; and, take in the work of local artists on the 9W Trail along the 9W business corridor displaying the Tug Boat Fleet during warm months, and illuminated by Candy Cane Lane during the winter holidays.

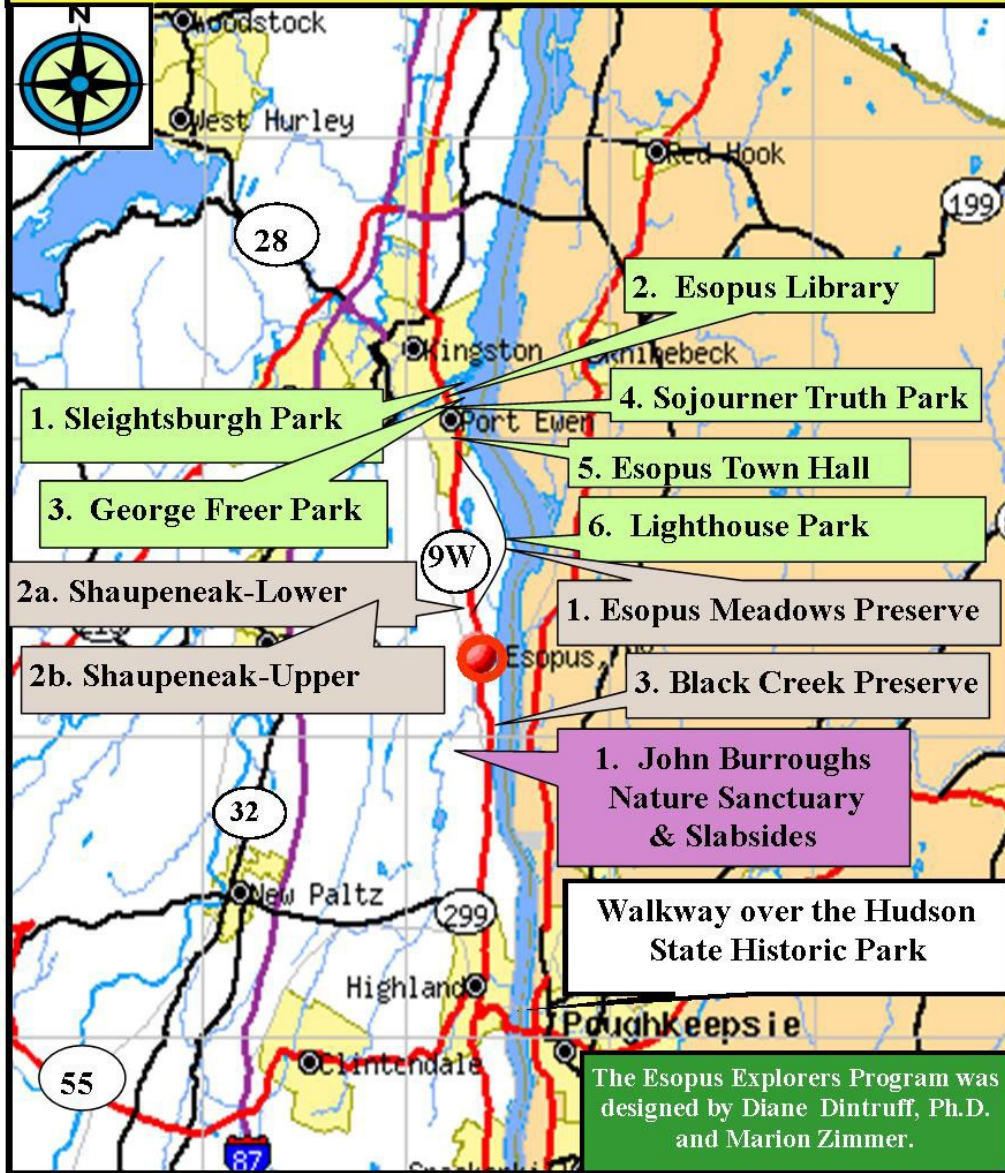
