


Environmental Protection Fund Investments in Rensselaer County Enhancing Our Economy and Improving Our Communities

The Environmental Protection Fund (EPF) has provided more than \$1 billion since 1993 to support critical programs that protect our clean water, public health, and industries including agriculture and tourism. Our local economy and good quality jobs have been enhanced and supported thanks to the EPF, which has pumped more than \$28 million into our local economy. Below are a few examples of how the EPF has paid off for Rensselaer County:

- More than **\$4.8 million** has been invested in protecting Rensselaer County's land and water, including almost 1,000 acres along the Taconic Ridge, many community parks and gardens, and 1,653 acres of local farmland, allowing working farms to continue to produce economically important fruits, vegetables and dairy products.
- Over **\$9 million** has been invested in waterfront revitalization, providing public access to waterways in Rensselaer, Troy and throughout the County.
- More than \$1.2 million has supported our museums, memorials and historic buildings that draw tourists and represent our cultural history, including the Children's Museum of Science and Technology, the Oakwood Cemetery and the Knickerbocker Family Mansion.
- ✓ Over \$5.7 million has been deployed in Rensselaer County to protect the Hudson River and improve public access by providing funding for upgrades to wastewater treatment systems, making improvements and expansions to Papscanee Island Nature Preserve, Rensselaer Riverwalk Trial, and Schodack Island State Park, providing educational programs, and improving boat launches and other public access points to the River.
- More than **\$4.5 million** toward municipal recycling. household hazardous waste, landfill closure and gas management programs in East Greenbush, East Nassau, Eastern Rensselaer County, Poestenkill, Sand Lake, Schodack, and Troy, assisting these municipalities with funding mandated waste disposal programs.
- ✓ Over \$1 million for farmers and municipalities to contain polluted runoff and comply with state and federal water quality mandates. This funding has reduced pollution entering the Hudson River and the Tomhannock Reservoir, which provides drinking water to residents of Troy.
